
 At the end of six months, breastfeeding rates fall to 43%, and only 13% of babies are exclusively breastfed.

Better infant health means fewer health insurance claims, less employee time off to care for sick children, and higher productivity.






Children who are breastfed for six months are less likely to become

Mothers who breastfeed have a decreased risk of breast and ovarian cancers.

Impact on Mothers

- Faster recovery from pregnancy and childbirth
- Lower risk of breast cancer
- Lower risk of osteoporosis
